



## LOCAL RULES

1. Management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret the following rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle questions and differences thereto or otherwise arising out of, or connected with, or pertaining to the California Collegiate Livestock Show at Porterville Fair.
2. All State rules published by the California Department of Food & Agriculture, Division of Fairs & Expositions are in force for the California Collegiate Livestock Show at Porterville Fair. Copies of the State Rules are available in the Fair office & online at [www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe](http://www.cdfa.ca.gov/fe).
3. There will be no flyers or notices posted or handed out without prior permission of show management.
4. There is no admission or parking fee for the California Collegiate Livestock Show at Porterville Fair.
5. **FIRST BEDDING WILL NOT BE PROVIDED BY MANAGEMENT.** Feed and bedding materials available for purchases on the show grounds are not guaranteed.
6. All exhibitors are responsible for cleaning their pens at the conclusion of the show.
7. No animals will be allowed on the fairgrounds unless they are entered to show or exhibit. No Nurse Cows allowed.
9. Exhibitors must be the bona fide owners of animals or exhibits entered by them for a minimum of 30 days, unless otherwise specified. \* Exception for commercial steer, lamb, hog and meat goat.
10. **FITTING & GROOMING:** Exhibitor may receive assistance in grooming, clipping or blocking from another exhibitor, his/her leader/advisor, or parent. The majority of the grooming should be done by the exhibitor.
11. **UNIFORM:** The show uniform shall consist of a Shirt/Blouse with collar (no tank tops or t-shirts) and denim jeans (No acid, stone wash or excessively worn jeans or shorts.) dress slacks or white pants.
12. There will be no alcoholic beverages on the grounds during the event. All alcohol will be confiscated and not returned.
13. Animals will be release upon conclusion of their specific show.
14. A brand inspection certificate or Bill of Sale must be available for inspection at all times for all cattle.
15. Exhibitors must have proof of ownership and/or registration papers available at all times.
16. All divisions and classes shall be judged under the American System of judging unless otherwise specified.
17. **PROTESTS:** Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of state or local rules. Judge's decision on awards **CANNOT** be protested. All protest must be presented to the livestock manager of the show in writing within 2 hours of the alleged violation and must be accompanied by a \$100.00 cash deposit (\$200.00 for animal health rule violations), which will be returned if the protest is deemed valid.
18. Overnight parking will be available in the designated area only. 30 AMP power is available at the rate of \$20.00 per night. Dry Camping is available at the rate of \$10.00 per night. Please complete the RV reservation form included in the catalog and submit the required fee with your entry forms.
19. **NO HEATERS, HEAT LAMPS OR GENERATORS ALLOWED IN BARNs OR BUILDING PER FIRE MARSHALL.**
20. **LIABILITY:** All exhibitors agree to defend indemnify and hold harmless the California Collegiate Livestock Show and the Porterville Fair from and against any liability, claim loss or expense (including reasonable attorney's fees) arising out of any injury or damage which is caused by, arises from or is any way connected with participation in the California Collegiate Livestock Show at Porterville Fair shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to the exhibitors or exhibits at the fair. The exhibitor (or parent or guardian of a minor) is responsible for any injury or damage resulting from the exhibitor's participation in the California Collegiate Livestock Show at Porterville Fair. This includes any injury to others or to the exhibitor or the exhibitor's property.
21. **ALL SCHOOLS ARE REQUIRED TO ASSIST IN DISASSEMBLY OF ALL PENS AND PANELS.**

## ENTRY INFORMATION

1. Entries are open to college students enrolled in agricultural courses and carrying a minimum of 12 units. See "DIVISIONS" for eligibility specifics.
2. ENTRY DEADLINES: It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that their entry forms arrive by the applicable entry deadline. The use of return-receipt, proof of mailing, hand-cancellation (postmarking) at the Post Office and Overnight guaranteed service are recommended. The California Collegiate Livestock Show at Porterville Fair is not responsible for any lost, delayed or misdirected mail. All animal entries must be postmarked by Thursday, February 28, 2019 or earlier to ensure acceptance without late fees. A metered postmark will not be considered as a valid postmark for entry deadline purposes. See below for late entry information.
3. \*LATE ENTRIES: will be accepted until 5 PM Friday, MARCH 8, 2019. Late entries must be in the Porterville Fair Administrative Office by 5:00 PM POSTMARKS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED ON LATE ENTRIES. Each late entry must be accompanied by a \$15.00 per class late fee (including showmanship) in addition to any applicable entry fees.
4. All entries must be accompanied by the full entry fees due in order to ensure acceptance. Please make entry checks payable to: Porterville Fair, 2700 W. Teapot Dome Avenue, Porterville, CA 93257
5. Entries for breeding animals must contain the ID, date of birth, sex, breed and if registered, the registration number of entry, and registration number of sire and dam (except in breeds where the registration papers do not include this information).
6. All animals shall be identified by a permanent number (ear tag, tattoo, scrapie #, photo or drawing, or brand required by breed association, ear notching or micro chip) on the animal which matches the number recorded on the entry form.
7. Management reserves the right to limit entries to facilities available and may limit the number of entries made by an exhibitor. Any return of entries under this rule will be done generally and without discrimination. Under any limitation of entries acceptance will be based on entry receiving date, except some eligible entries may be accepted to ensure and equitable representation of specie or breed.
8. Management reserves the right to add, combine or split classes and/or divisions as deemed in the best interest of the show. Management is not responsible for any awards offered by breed association or sponsors, although every effort will be made to ensure their delivery to the proper exhibitors.
9. All entries must be made on entry forms supplied by the California Collegiate Livestock Show (photocopies are acceptable). Faxed and/or emailed entries will be accepted when accompanied by credit card information.
10. Use separate entry forms for each division of livestock. Commercial and breeding animals have separate forms. All entry fees must be submitted at time of entry. Refer to each division for fee schedules.
11. Beef blocking chutes and trimming tables will be restricted to designated areas.
12. There will be a \$25.00 fee for checks returned by the bank. Returned checks must be substituted by cash or money order only, accompanied by the \$25.00 fee.
13. There is no limitation on the number of animals an exhibitor may enter, unless otherwise specified.
14. Sheep and Goats are not to be muzzled while on the fairgrounds. Muzzles will be confiscated and will not be returned.
15. Management reserves the right to physically handle any animal on the fairgrounds at their discretion.

# DIVISION

## COLLEGE SHOW TEAM DIVISION

Exhibitors in the College Show must be currently enrolled in college agricultural courses with a minimum of 12 units. They need not be the owner of the animal if the animal is owned or managed by the College, but must be under his/her care and management as a project for at least 30 days prior to opening day of show. Entry form(s) must be signed by college agricultural instructor. College groups must be under the supervision of an authorized instructor.

With the exception of registered animals, neither exhibitors nor the institutions that they represent will be required to own the animals that they exhibit at this show. Borrowing of animals is permitted, so long as all other show requirements are met. Animals being exhibited in registered purebred classes must either be registered in the name of the exhibitor or the institution he/she represents. Registered breeding divisions, the owner on the registration certificate must match the exhibitor on the entry form.

## BEEF CATTLE DIVISION

Entry Deadline Postmarked by: Thursday, February 28, 2019. (See "Entry Information" for late entry specifics.)

### COMMERCIAL STEERS

Permanent identification is required on all animals (i.e. eartag, tattoo, etc.) and must be indicated on entry form.

No foreign substances are to be injected, pumped, drenched or otherwise forced upon any animal.

**WEIGHT POLICY:** Exhibitors will be responsible for bringing their animal(s) to the scale between 6:00 PM and 8:00 PM Friday. There will be no "re-weighing" of animals unless deemed necessary by Show Management and/or their chosen representatives. Weight classes will be determined by Management. Wild steers will not be permitted. Steers must be able to safely cross the scale.

**ENTRY FEE:** \$35.00 per head per class
