SHOW PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

The purpose of this livestock show is to provide a statewide career development event for community colleges and universities with agriculture/animal science programs. Through participation in this event, students will:

- Utilize critical soft skills (e.g., communication, work ethic, time management, and teamwork) in the attainment of team goals and objectives.
- Apply safe and ethical animal handling techniques to the management, care and exhibition of a selected species of livestock.
- Practice important interpersonal skills (e.g., professionalism, integrity, and good judgement) while participating in a competitive event.
- Enhance attainment of technical skills (e.g., livestock evaluation, animal handling, and showmanship) through interaction with livestock industry leaders (i.e., official judges).

SHOW RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. **All entry forms must be typed (entry forms are form fillable PDFs)**; once completed, typed entry forms should be emailed to PortervilleFair93257@gmail.com or mailed via USPS.
- 2. Management reserves the final and absolute right to interpret the following rules and regulations and to arbitrarily settle questions and differences thereto or otherwise arising out of, or connected with, or pertaining to the California Collegiate Livestock Show at Porterville Fair.
- 3. All exhibitors are responsible for cleaning their pens at the conclusion of the show.
- 4. No animals will be allowed on the fairgrounds unless they are entered to show or exhibit. No Nurse Cows allowed.
- 5. Exhibitors need not be the owner of the animal(s) they exhibit if the animal is owned or managed by the College, but the animal(s) must be under his/her care and management as a project for at least 30 days prior to opening day of the show.
- 6. With the exception of registered animals, neither exhibitors nor the institutions that they represent will be required to own the animals that they exhibit at this show. Borrowing of animals is permitted, so long as all other show requirements are met.
- 7. Animals being exhibited in registered purebred classes must either be registered in the name of the exhibitor <u>or</u> the institution that he/she represents.
- 8. FITTING & GROOMING: Exhibitor may receive assistance in grooming, clipping, or blocking from another exhibitor, his/her leader/advisor, or parent. The majority of the grooming should be done by the exhibitor.
- 9. UNIFORM: The show uniform shall consist of a Shirt/Blouse with collar (no tank tops or t-shirts) and denim jeans (no excessively worn jeans or shorts) dress slacks or white pants.
- 10. There will be no alcoholic beverages on the grounds during the event. All alcohol will be confiscated and not returned.
- 11. Animals will be released upon conclusion of their specific show.
- 12. A brand inspection certificate or Bill of Sale must be available for inspection at all times for all cattle.
- 13. Exhibitors must have proof of ownership and/or registration papers available at all times.
- 14. All divisions and classes shall be judged under the American System of judging unless otherwise specified.
- 15. PROTESTS: Protests will be considered only if there has been a violation of show rules. Judge's decision on awards CANNOT be protested. All protests must be presented to the livestock manager of the show in writing within 1 hour of the alleged violation and must be accompanied by a \$100.00 cash deposit, which will be returned if the protest is deemed valid.
- 16. Overnight parking will be available in the designated area only. 30 AMP power is available at the rate of \$25.00 per night. Dry Camping is available at the rate of \$10.00 per night. Please complete the RV reservation form included in the catalog and submit the required fee with your entry forms.
- 17. LIABILITY: All exhibitors agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the California Collegiate Livestock Show and the Porterville Fair from and against any liability, claim loss or expense (including reasonable attorney's fees) arising out of any injury or damage which is caused by, arises from or is any way connected with participation in the

California Collegiate Livestock Show. The Porterville Fair shall not be responsible for accidents or losses that may occur to the exhibitors or exhibits at the Porterville fairgrounds. The exhibitor (or parent or guardian of a minor) is responsible for any injury or damage resulting from the exhibitor's participation in the California Collegiate Livestock Show at Porterville Fair. This includes any injury to others or to the exhibitor or the exhibitor's property.

- 18. ALL SCHOOLS ARE REQUIRED TO ASSIST IN DISASSEMBLY OF ALL BEEF & HOG PANELS ONLY.
- 19. There is no admission or parking fee for the California Collegiate Livestock Show at Porterville Fair.

SHOW ENTRY INFORMATION

- 1. Exhibitors in the California Collegiate Livestock Show must be currently enrolled in college agricultural courses with a minimum of 12 units.
- 2. Entry form(s) must be signed by college agricultural instructor.
- 3. Entry fees are listed on entry forms.
- 4. College groups must be under the supervision of an authorized instructor.
- 5. **ENTRY DEADLINES**: It is the exhibitor's responsibility to ensure that their entry forms arrive by the applicable entry deadline. The use of return-receipt, proof of mailing, hand-cancellation (postmarking) at the Post Office and overnight guaranteed service are recommended. The California Collegiate Livestock Show at Porterville Fair is not responsible for any lost, delayed or misdirected mail. All animal entries must be postmarked by WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 20, 2023, or earlier to ensure acceptance without late fees. A <u>metered postmark will not be considered</u> as a valid postmark for entry deadline purposes. See below for late entry information.
- 6. **LATE ENTRIES**: Entries received or postmarked after SEPTEMBER 20, 2023, are late. Late entries will be accepted until FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 29, 2023, 5:00 PM. Each late entry must be accompanied by a \$25.00 per class late fee (including showmanship) in addition to any applicable entry fees.
- 7. All entries must be accompanied by the full entry fees due in order to ensure acceptance. Please make entry checks payable to: Porterville Fair, 2700 W. Teapot Dome Avenue, Porterville, CA 93257
- 8. Entries for breeding animals must contain the ID, date of birth, sex, breed and if registered, the registration number of entry, and registration number of sire and dam (except in breeds where the registration papers do not include this information).
- 9. All animals shall be identified by a permanent number (i.e., ear tag, tattoo, scrapie #, photo or drawing, or brand required by breed association, ear notching or microchip) on the animal which matches the number recorded on the entry form.
- 10. Management reserves the right to add, combine or split classes and/or divisions as deemed in the best interest of the show.
- 11. All entries must be made on current years entry forms supplied by the California Collegiate Livestock Show (photocopies are acceptable). Emailed entries will be accepted when accompanied by credit card information.
- 12. Use separate entry forms for each division of livestock. Commercial and breeding animals have separate forms. All entry fees must be submitted at time of entry.
- 13. No foreign substances are to be injected, pumped, drenched, or otherwise forced upon any animal.
- 14. There are no minimum nor maximum weight restrictions.
- 15. There is no limitation on the number of animals an exhibitor may enter, unless otherwise specified.
- 16. Management reserves the right to physically handle any animal on the fairgrounds at their discretion.
- 17. FIRST BEDDING WILL NOT BE PROVIDED BY MANAGEMENT. Bedding materials available for purchase on the show grounds are not guaranteed.

SHOW DIVISIONS AND CLASSES

Permanent identification is required on all animals (i.e., ear tag, tattoo, etc.) and must be indicated on entry.

DIVISION 2 – REGISTERED BREEDING BEEF CATTLE

Acceptable proof of registered ownership may be provided via official registration certificate, a print-out from the registry (association) website, or electronic display (e.g., via smart phone or laptop) from the registry (association) website. Proof of ownership must clearly show the name of the animal's registered owner as well as the animal's name, registration number, and birth date. All breeds will be judged together. Classes are to be divided by age. Permanent identification is required on all animals (i.e., ear tag, tattoo, etc.) and must be indicated on entry forms.

All commercial lambs must be wether or ewe lambs with no more than 10 days fleece (from head to hock) and showing lambs teeth. All sheep must have a scrapies tag.
