At the direction of the fair veterinarian and the fair board, all exhibitors, leaders and parent or legal guardians must sign this document and acknowledge that the following statements are true for animals intended for sale and slaughter. By signing this document, the exhibitor and their parents or legal guardian acknowledge that you are absolutely and solely responsible for the care and custody of your animal during all operating hours of the fair.

- 1. The withdrawal time has been met if any growth stimulating implant has been used.
- 2. The withdrawal time has been met if medicated feed has been fed.
- 3. The withdrawal time has been met if any medication (antibiotic, wormer, insecticide, etc.) has been given orally, topically, or by injections.
- 4. Note: Drug testing for your animal will occur at the slaughterhouse by representatives of the United States Department of Agriculture. A positive test will result in legal action taken by the USDA with the exhibitor, parent, legal guardian, and /or leader or advisor.
- 5. If feeding tallow in your rations, federal law (21CFR:589) requires that insoluble impurities within tallow cannot exceed 0.15%.
- 6. No feeds containing mammalian tissue (meat and bone meal) have been fed to this animal.
- Cattle sold in the livestock auction at Porterville Fair are either: 1) of domestic origin; or 2) cattle that have originated from Mexico and/or Canada and have resided in the United States for a minimum of 100 days.
